Message from the Principal

Dear Parents and Guardians,

I hope you are doing well and that you are keeping safe during such testing hours. The pandemic has taken a toll on all of us but what matters most is that we are still forging ahead, trying to find the silver lining despite the situation.

I would like to express my sincere appreciation and gratitude to each and every parent and guardian for your continuous cooperation and understanding throughout these months. Without your belief and support in us, we would not have been able to reach this far.

I would also like to seize this opportunity to congratulate the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) Class of 2021 for their outstanding results! This year's achievements are the best till date and I would like to commend each graduate for their hard work, determination and perseverance. Despite having to learn during such difficult times, and embrace online learning, the graduates have beat all odds to come out successfully on the other side.

The May 2021 session consisted of a total of 87 candidates. The following are their results:

- Average Diploma Score: 33.32. This is above the global average of 33.02.
- Average Diploma Grade: 5.50. This

is above the global point average of 5.19.

- Percentage of students achieving 40-45 points: 11.30%. This is above the global average of 9.10%.
- Diploma Pass Rate: 84.81%

As this would not have been possible without the hard work and dedication of all our teachers, I would also like to take this opportunity to express my sincere gratitude to the IBDP team of teachers. To celebrate the graduating class, Ullens hosted a two-part hybrid Graduation Ceremony that consisted of a virtual ceremony and a series of short in-person ceremonies, about which you can read more in the current edition.

Moving forwards with a spirit of optimism, we are planning to hold a socially distanced and downsized graduation ceremony for our Grade Twelve, Class of 2021 students once they complete their Board examinations. We hope to host a ceremony that properly celebrates the students' accomplishments. More information on this will be available to you in the coming days.

On a similar note, with the new academic session for Grade 11 and IBDP students commencing, I would like to extend a warm welcome to the incoming Class of 2023. The next two years of your academic journey is bound to be



an enriching one, and we hope you approach it with zeal and enthusiasm. We also hope that here at Ullens, you find all the essential tools you need, to enable you to push through the boundaries and evolve into future leaders and changemakers of our country.

As an educational institution, Ullens strives to provide quality education to our students. Regardless of the current Covid scenario, our teachers are putting in time and effort to ensure that learning is continued effectively. Simultaneously, the School is working towards further enrichment, and particularly considering the prevailing situation, we have started conversations with several organizations to integrate and embrace digital tools and technology into our learning.

Our beloved alumni are also an integral part of the Ullens community. A HELPING HAND TO NUTRITION REHABILITATION HOME (NRH)

The Ullens Education Foundation (UEF) is collaborating with Nutrition Rehabilitation Home (NRH), a program of Nepal Youth Foundation, in its effort in dealing with the current Covid crisis.

NRH is driven with the objective to restore the health of children suffering from malnutrition. In this context, it had been distributing Lito (a blend of corn, soya and wheat), free of cost, to numerous orphanages, old-age homes and individuals suffering from malnutrition. However, as the ever-increasing Covid infection rates in the country and the subsequent lockdowns resulted in zero malnutrition in-patients, NRH took the step to shift its services to a care home for Covid infected patients. Subsequently, this led to an urgent need for a facility to prepare Lito; a suitable place where the preparation process requiring rinsing, drying, removing impurities, roasting, grinding and packing could take place.



This is where the UEF stepped in and extended a helping hand to NRH, providing the Ullens Kindergarten facility at Jawalakhel. At the start, NRH used the facility from September 2020 for about a period of six months. Now, the program has been using the facility from June 2021 onwards. Additionally, our cafeteria staff have also been working with the NRH team on a daily basis.

We are grateful to be able to make a small contribution in the lives of children suffering from malnutrition through the NRH program during such testing times.



CONGRATULATIONS: DR. BISWO NATH POUDEL

The Ullens Education Foundation extends its heartiest congratulations to Dr. Biswo Nath Poudel on his appointment as the Vice Chair of Nepal's National Planning Commission (NPC). Dr. Poudel served as a Member of the Board of Trustees of the UEF from August 2019 to July 2021. He continues to be part of our Ullens Parents Community, with his daughter studying in Ullens Kindergarten.

Dr. Poudel is an Economist holding specializations in natural resources economics, labor economics and economic history. He holds a PhD in Agricultural and Resource Economics from the University of California, Berkeley. He has published papers in prominent economics journals and given presentations at many national and international conferences. As one of the leading young economists of our country, he is a frequent contributor on economic issues to the Nepali media.

Dr. Poudel has previously served as an advisor to the Vice Chair of the NPC. His past experiences include working as an Economic Advisor at the International Labour Organization

(ILO), and an Economist at the Millennium Challenge Corporation (MCC) Nepal Office. He has also served as a Visiting Associate Professor at the Kathmandu University School of Management, and as a Member of the Board of Directors of the Middle Tamor Hydropower Company (73MW).



As Dr. Poudel resigns from UEF's Board of Trustees, we would like to express our sincerest gratitude for his time and dedication to the Foundation. His inputs and expertise on financial matters, and his passion for service and for creating a progressive work environment,

have been invaluable in moving the organization forward. We wish him all the best for his future endeavors.

AMIDST THE COVID CRISIS, ULLENS SCHOOL SUPPORTS THE NATIONAL TRAUMA CENTER

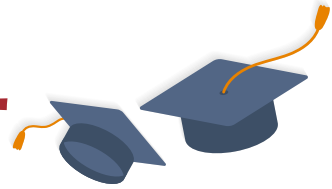

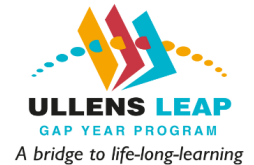

Ullens LEAP is the first of its kind gap year program in Nepal designed for high school graduates taking a gap year. Applications are now open for the inaugural batch of the program. The program is divided into three terms of three months each. While we recommend that students take all three terms to get the best program experience, they may opt for one or more terms. The application deadline is August 31, and the first term starts in early September.

The program consists of five integrated blocks conducted via both online and safe on-site modes. The Higher Education Support block supports students in their college applications and studies. The Tech Smart block acquaints students with digital world fundamentals useful in their academic and professional domains. Likewise, students are offered life skills and the essentials of leadership through the Life Smart block. This block also features foundation skills for the global workspace like

negotiation, communications and networking. On the other hand, the Academic block presents introductory courses from various disciplines to help students explore their academic interests. Furthermore, the Insights to Nepal block prepares students to stay true to their roots as they learn skill-sets for becoming global citizens.

Our (optional) outdoor learning components will take the students to places outside their comfort zone to learn leadership, develop self-reflection skills and build confidence. The gap year program, in a nutshell, provides the needed knowledge, skills and experience to help students make the most out of their gap year.

While we cannot wait for the situation to be safe enough to welcome everyone back to school in person, our school continues to operate its full curriculum in virtual mode.

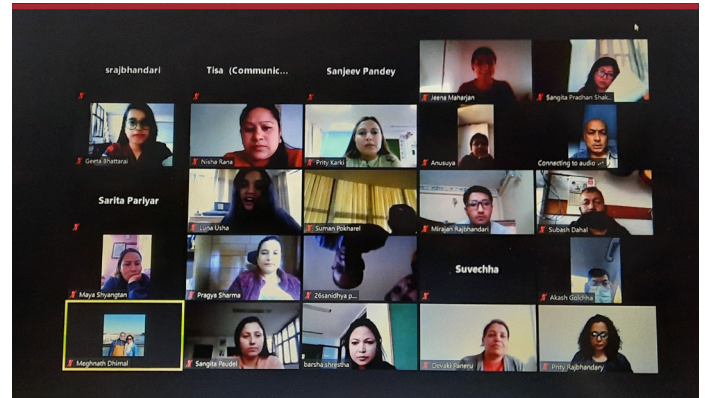
Grade I: Curriculum Evening 2021

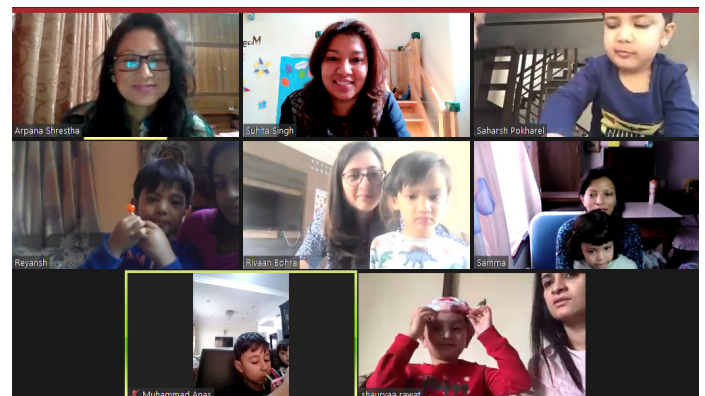
Grades II to X: Curriculum Evening 2021

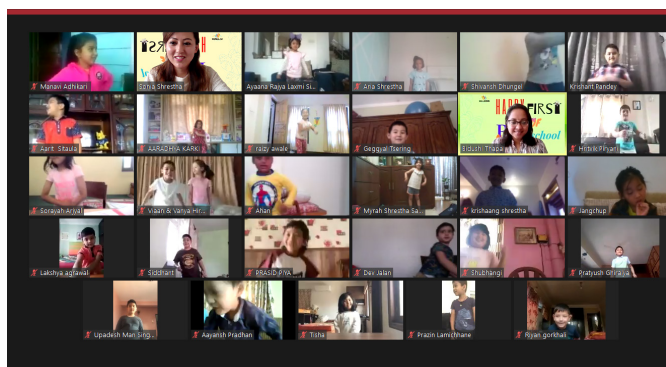
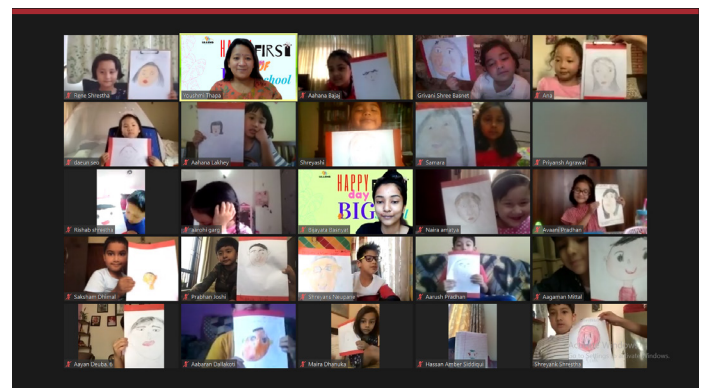
Kindergarten First Day of School

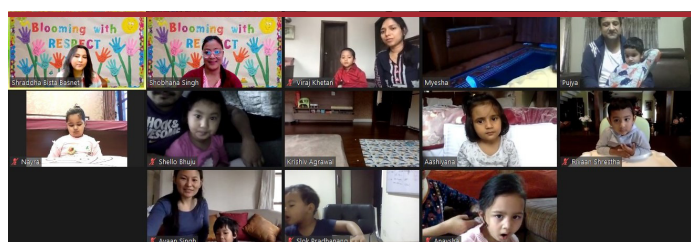


Discussion Meeting on the COVID Scenario

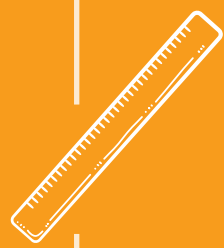

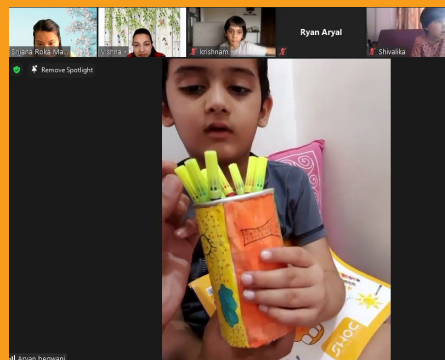
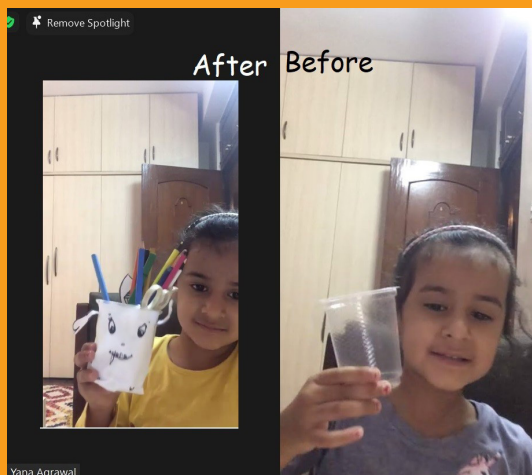


KINDERGARTEN VIRTUAL EXHIBITION DAY 2021



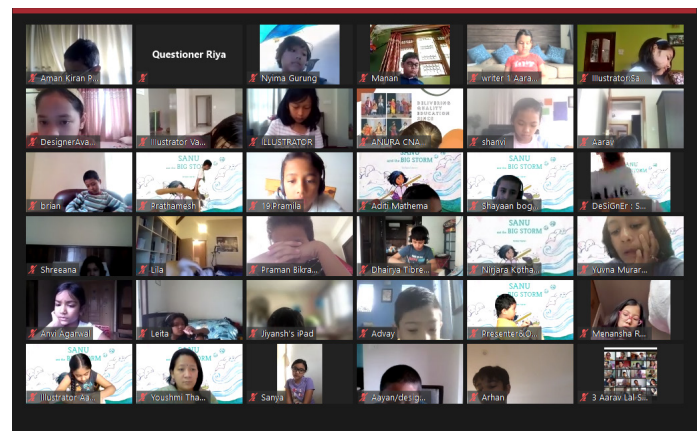
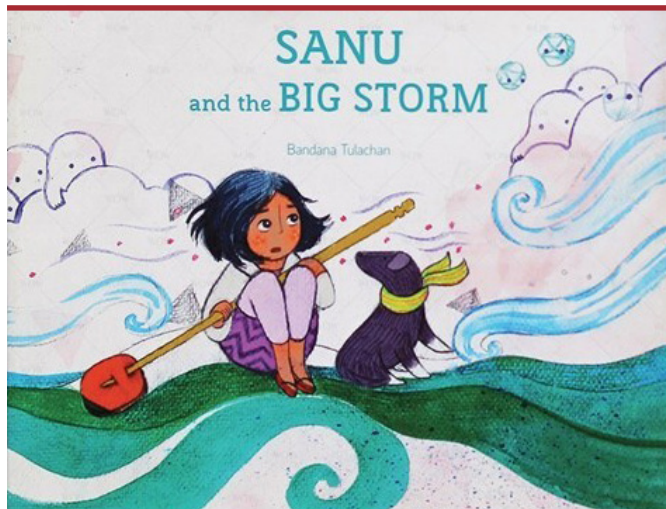

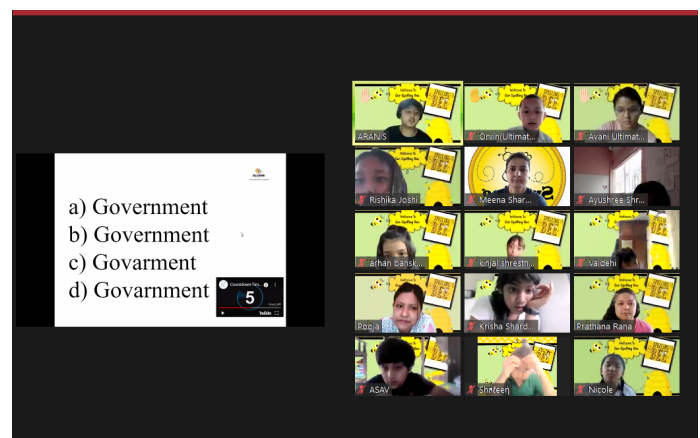
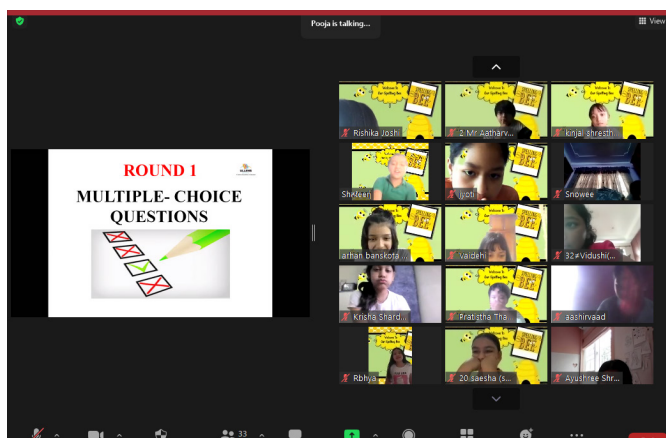
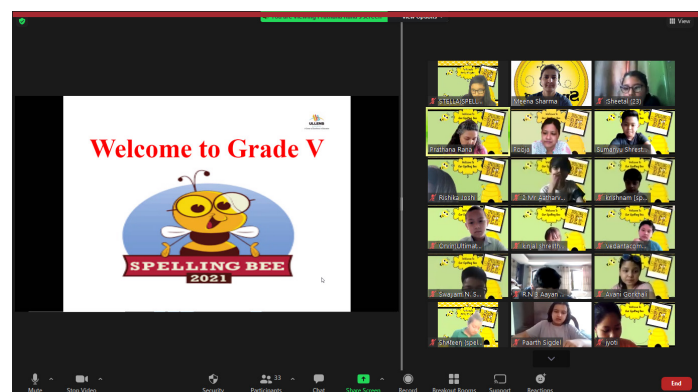
Grade III Virtual Author's Meet with Ms. Bandana Tulachan

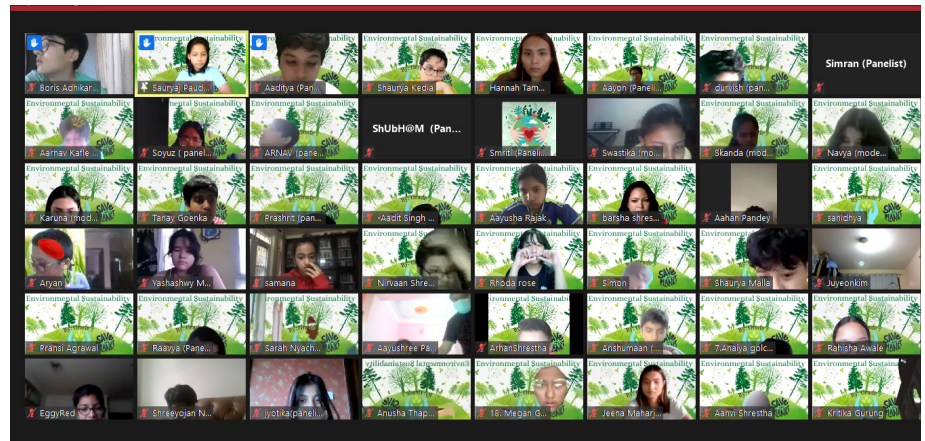
Grade IV and V: Spelling Bee 2021

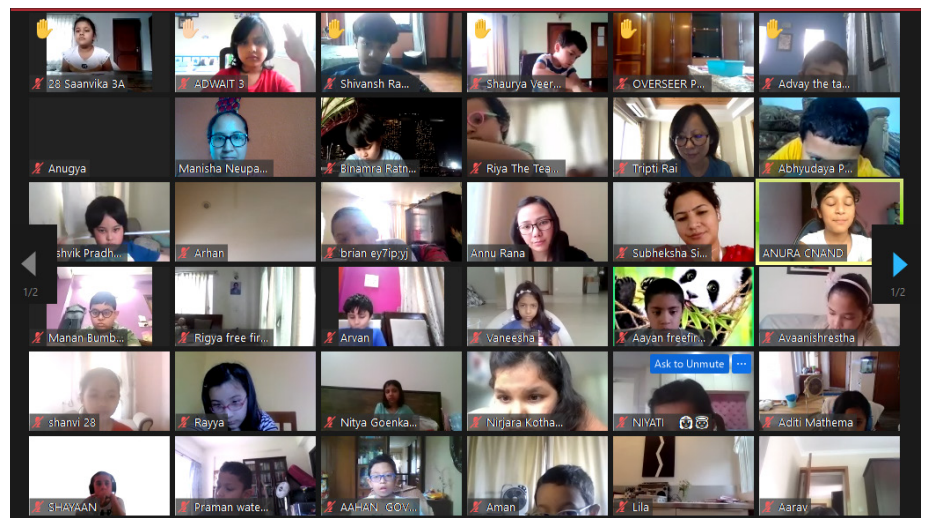
Grade III: Interaction with Ms. Tripti Rai, Country Director, WaterAid Nepal

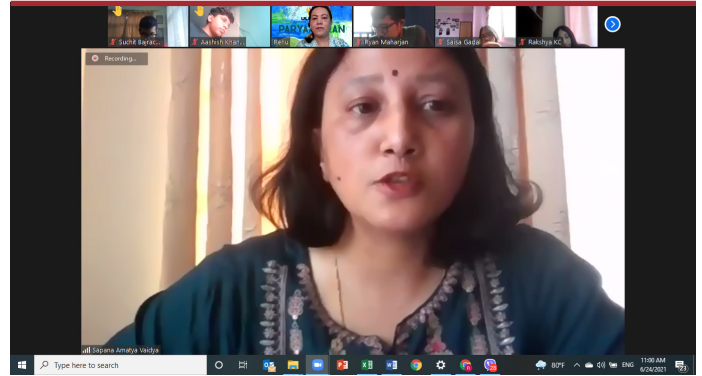

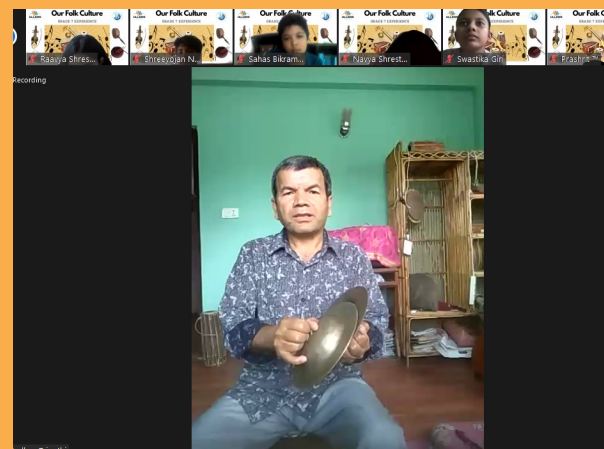
Grade X: Interactive session with Dr. Sapana Amatya Vaidya, Gynecologist and Obstetrician

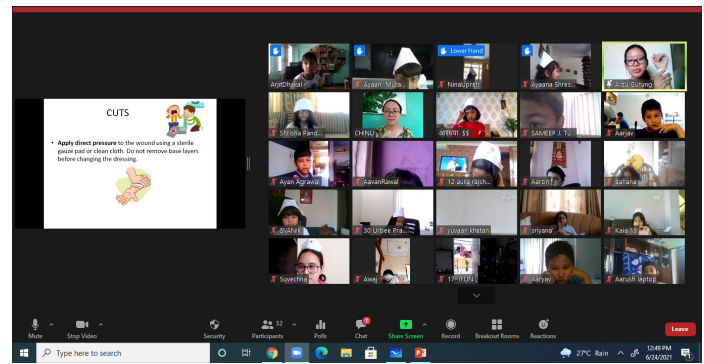
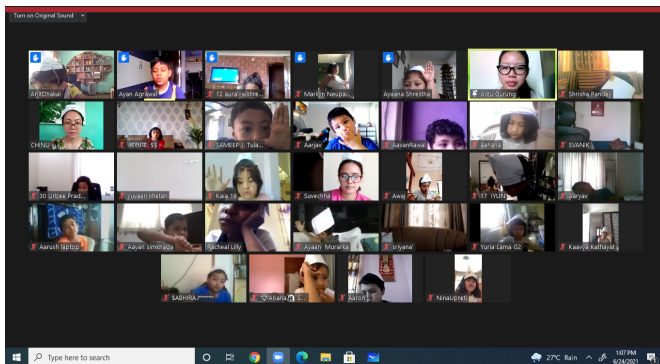
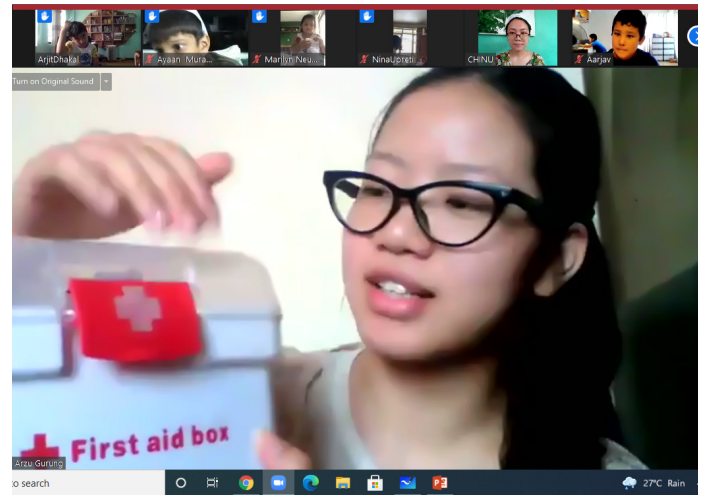
GRADE VII: OUR FOLK CULTURE

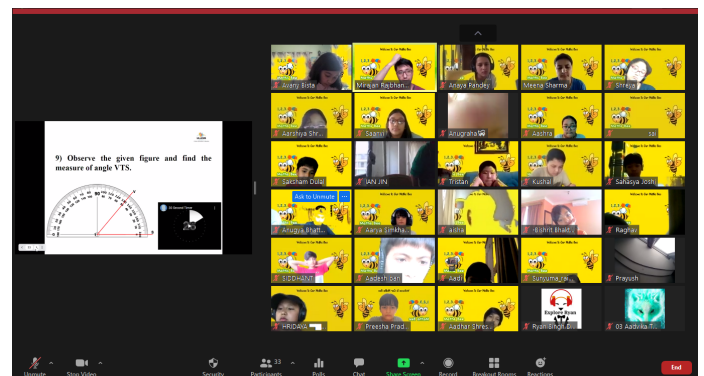
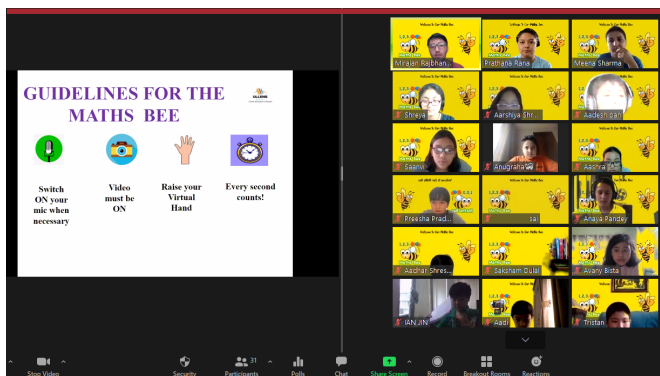
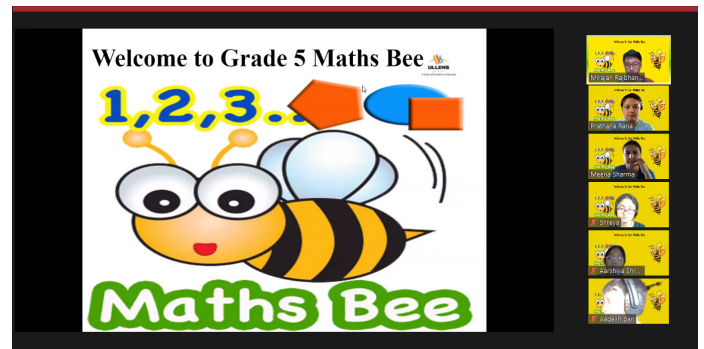
Grade II: Interaction with the School Nurse, Ms. Arzu Gurung

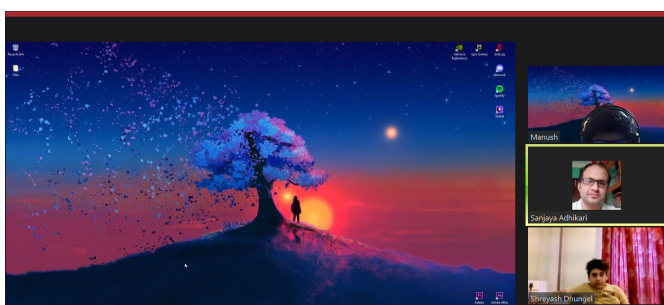
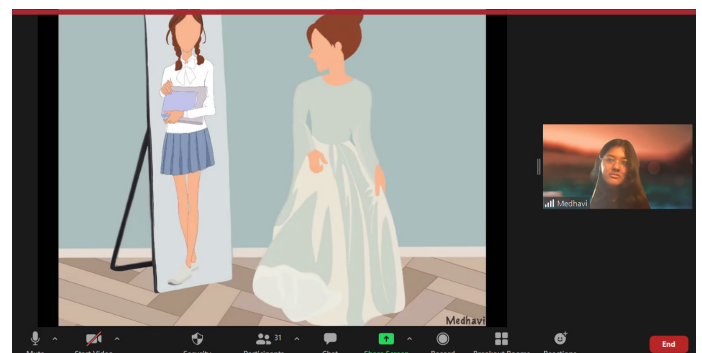
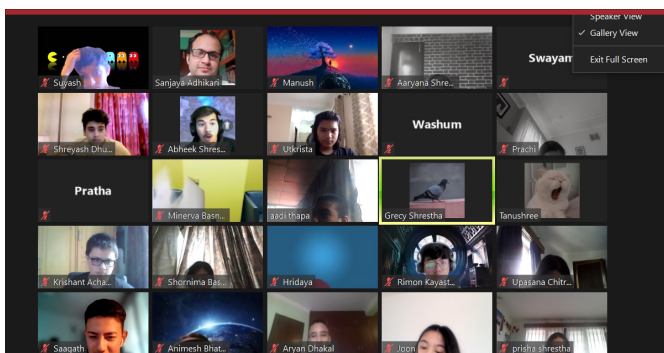
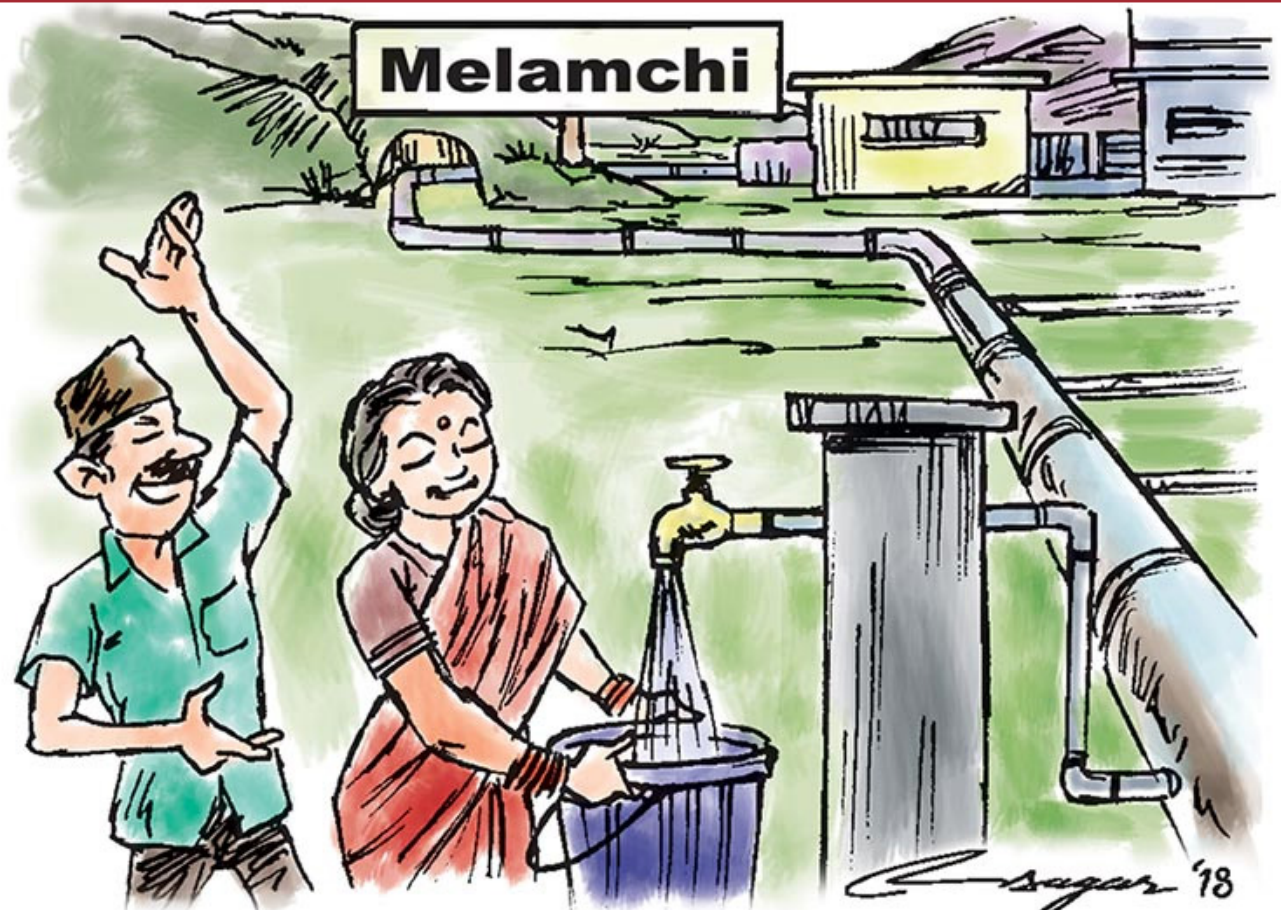
Grade IV and V: Math Bee 2021

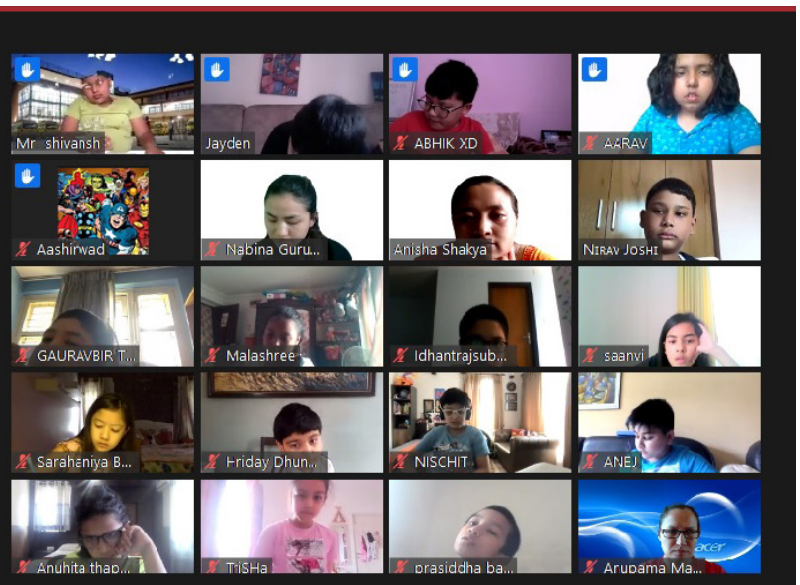
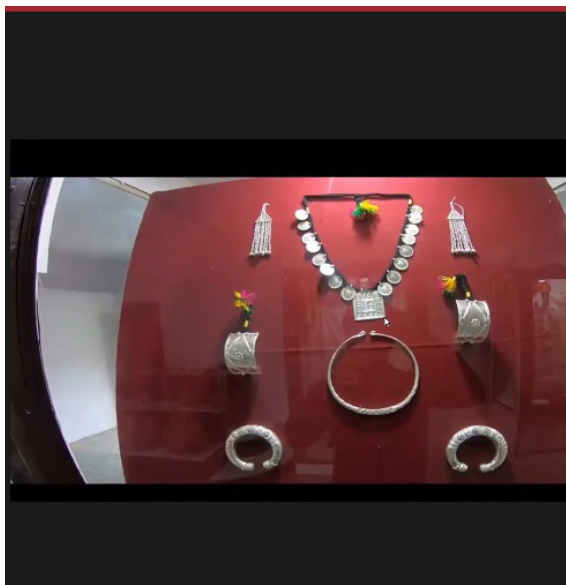
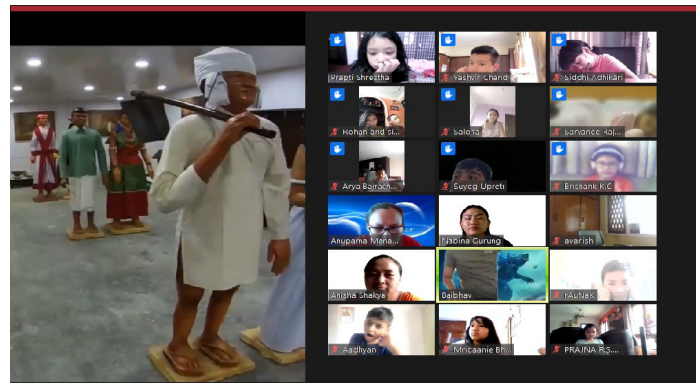
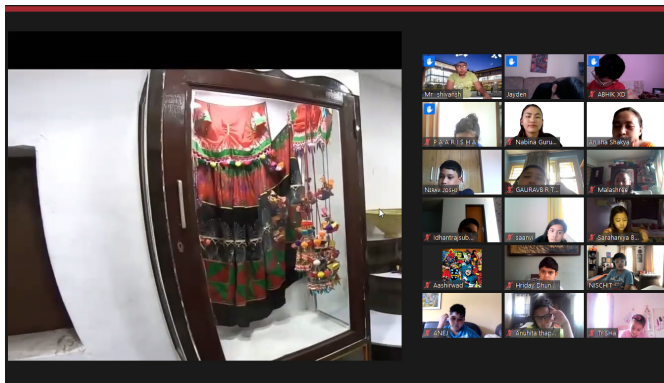
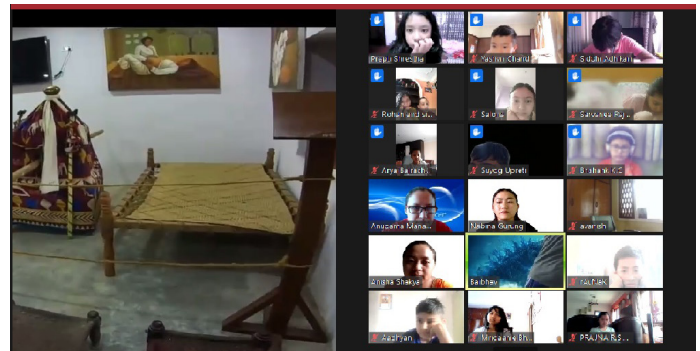
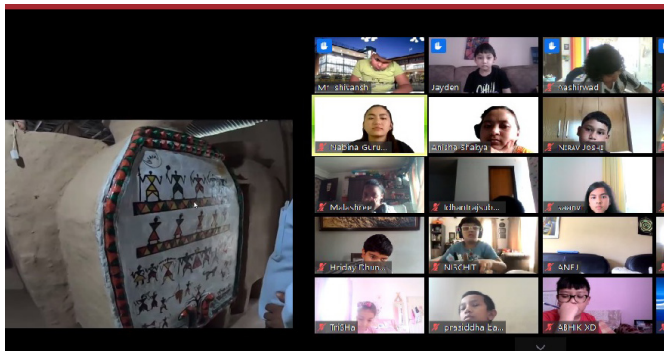
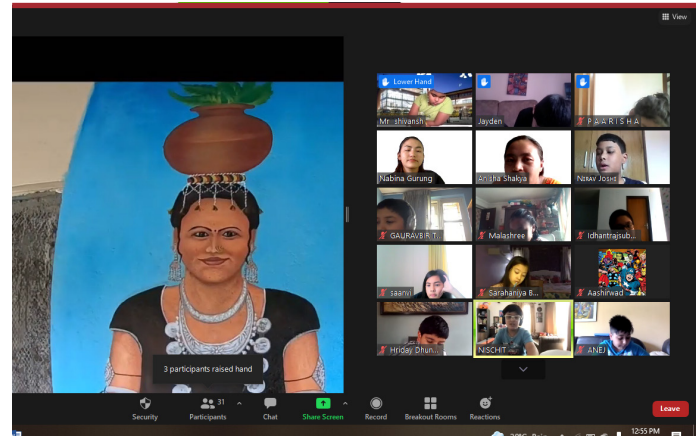
Grade IX: Presentations on Infrastructure of Development
